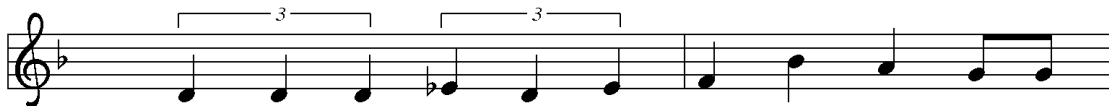

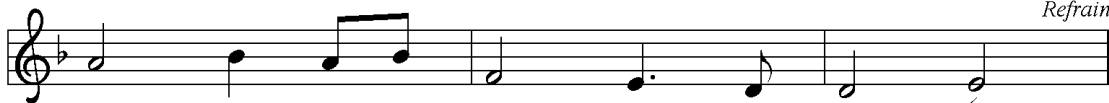

## Acts 2:1-21
