

#### Apostle's Creed





#### **Eucharistic Prayer**

P: Holy is your name.

and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ, whom you sent in the fullness of time to be a light to the nations.

You scatter the proud in the imagination of their hearts and have mercy on those who fear you from generation to generation.

You put down the mighty from their thrones and exalt those of low degree.

You fill the hungry with good things, and the rich you sent empty away.

- P: Your own Son came among us as a servant, to be Emmanuel, your presence with us.

  He humbled himself in obedience to your will and freely accepted death on a cross
- P: On the night he offered himself up for us he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."
- P: When the supper was over he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples and said: "Drink from this, all of you; for this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.
- P: By his suffering, death, and resurrection you delivered us from captivity to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant
- P: Therefore, in remembrance of all your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we ask you to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving
- P: Send your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts that in the breaking of the bread and the drinking of this wine we may know the presence of the living Christ; as we look forward to that day foretold by prophets and apostles, when the One who came in humility and who comes today in Word and Sacrament shall come in final victory.
- P: Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever.

P: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:

C: Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those
who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours,
now and forever. Amen.
