





P: Lift up your hearts.



Sanctus

P: In his baptism and in his table fellowship he took his place with sinners. He preached good news to the poor, proclaimed release to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, set free the oppressed, and announced that the time had come when you would save your people.

P: On the night his disciples betrayed him he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:


"Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

P: When the supper was over he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples and said:

P: Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **Amen.**




