Children's Message

First Reading

Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

¹ After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ² But Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." ⁴ But the word of the LORD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." ⁵ He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶ And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

⁷ Then he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." ⁸ But he said, "O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" ⁹ He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. ¹¹ And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

¹² As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

¹⁷ When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. ¹⁸ On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates."

- ⁶ Even now my head is lifted up above my enemies | who surround me. Therefore I will offer sacrifice in the sanctuary, sacrifices of rejoicing; I will sing and make music | to the LORD.
- ⁷ Hear my voice, O LORD, ¹ when I call; have mercy on me and ¹ answer me.
- My heart speaks your message— "Seek my face." Your face, O LORD, I will seek.
- ⁹ Hide not your face from me, turn not away from your ser- ¹ vant in anger. Cast me not away—you have been my helper; forsake me not, O God of ¹ my salvation.
- ¹⁰ Though my father and my moth- | er forsake me, the LORD will | take me in.
- ¹¹ Teach me your [|] way, O LORD; lead me on a level path, because of [|] my oppressors.
- ¹² Subject me not to the will ¹ of my foes, for they rise up against me, false witnesses ¹ breathing violence.
- ¹³ This I believe—that I will see the goodness ^I of the LORD in the land ^I of the living!
- ¹⁴ Wait for the LORD | and be strong. Take heart and wait | for the LORD!

Second Reading


Philippians 3:17-4:1

The Gospel Luke 13:31-35







P: With this bread and cup we remember our Lord's passover from death to life as we proclaim the mystery of faith:




P: O God of resurrection and new life: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine. Bless this feast. Grace our table with your presence.






Communion Invitation


