Ruth M. Dodds, 85, passed away Dec. 1, 2025, DeLand, Florida.

Ruth was born Jan. 17, 1940, in Baraga, Michigan, to the late Carl and Martha Hartikka. Her brother (the late) Carl was born two years later. Ruth had many cousins whom she was close to and maintained those relationships throughout her life.

Ruth grew up in Chicago in Wrigleyville. She attended and was confirmed in her faith at Trinity Lutheran Church. Ruth attended Lake View High School. She was a member of the synchronized swimming team while at Lake View.

She met and married Ralph O. Dodds, on Feb. 10, 1962. They subsequently had Brian, Bradley and Kimberly. In 1968, they moved to NorthCenter where they lived until their retirement in 2003. Ralph and Ruth were a united front and put each other first always. They were welcoming of their childrens' friends, whether to eat dinner or sleepover. Many a summer night sat on the front porch and conversed with friends and neighbors.

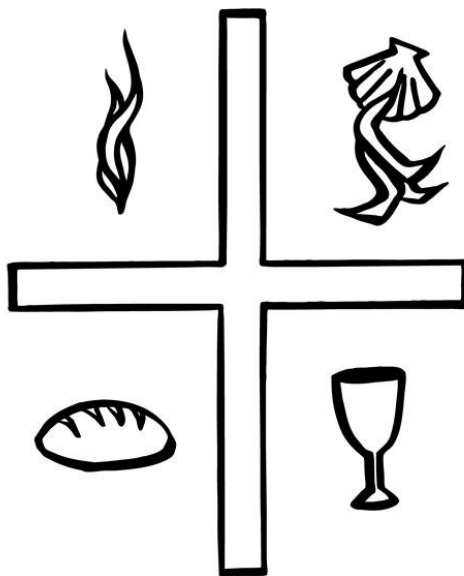

She then worked in the girls' dorm before finally moved to the front office. Ruth loved her job and the friendships she made with co-workers.

Ruth and Ralph moved to Florida in 2003. She had a very active social life, hosting card nights and holiday parties. She loved to go to dinner with friends. She was active in the church. She liked to host visitors and would gladly go on days trips throughout Florida. She and Ralph continued to travel, preferring cruises to the Caribbean islands and around Europe.

Ruth is survived by her husband, Ralph; sons Brian (Melinda) and Bradley (Kandy); daughter Kimberly (the late Ronald) Baratta; foster son Jeffrey Whipson (Sara); four grandchildren, Blake (Terri), Kyle, Korey (Karlynn) and Corbett, and two great-grandchildren, Kyra and Oliver.

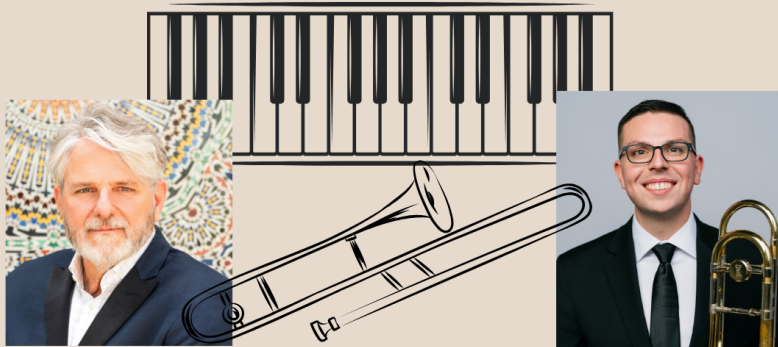
