

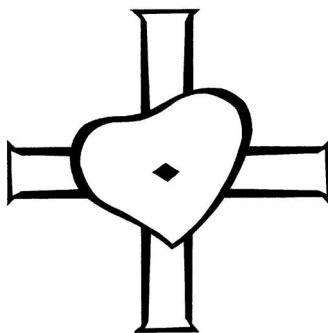
Post Communion Prayer
