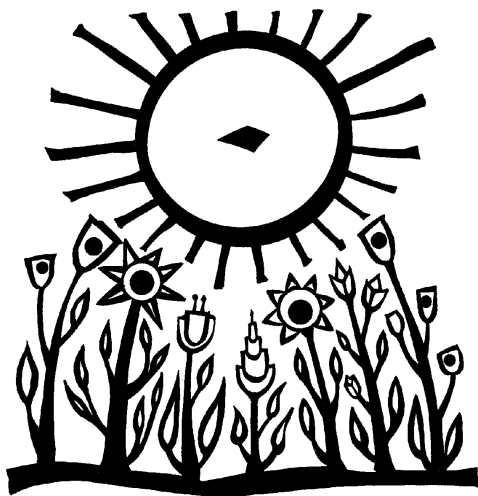

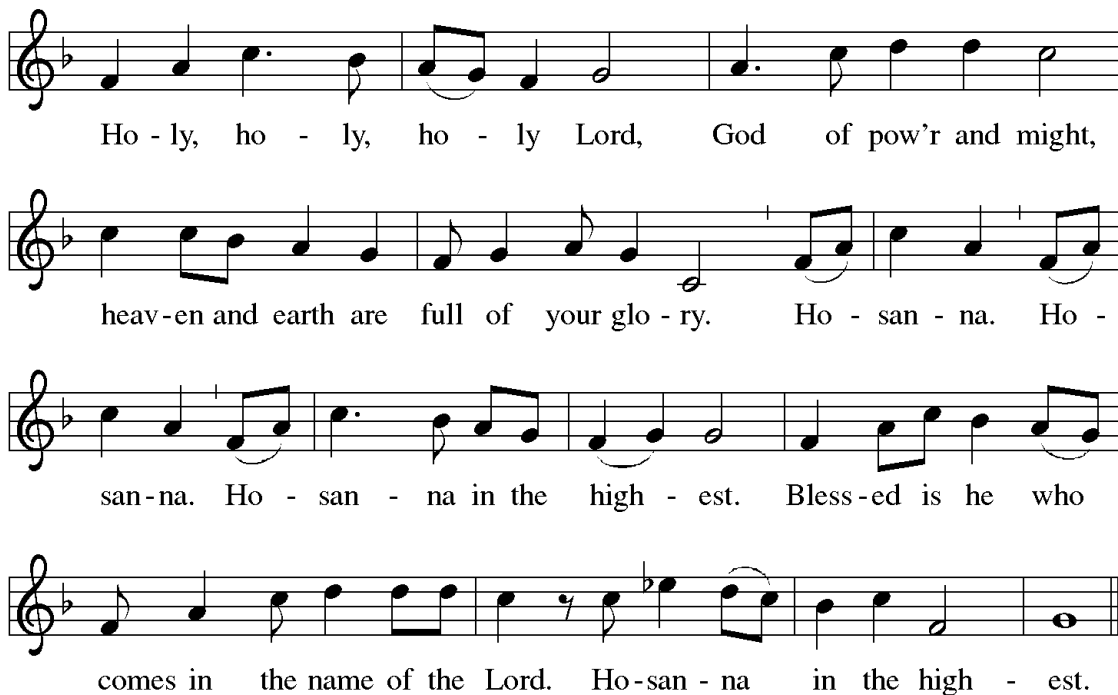

Sanctus



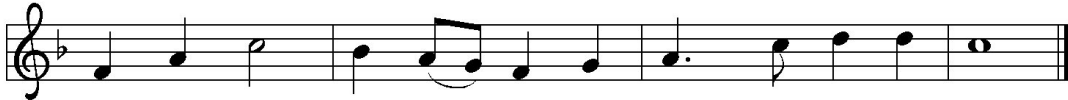
Ho - ly, ho - ly, ho - ly Lord, God of pow'r and might,

C: Amen.

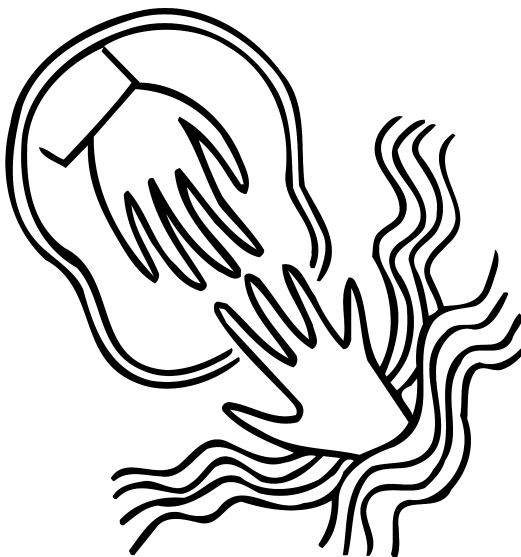
Post Communion Prayer
